Sabre TTRR offers free consultation to Depts. that are seeking to set up, or expand the existing capabilities of Specialized Tactical Units. *Sabre TTRR* is able to advise and give support, with regard to equipment purchases, and *Team* selection criterion. Utilizing what we consider to be the best support weaponry available.

This includes less lethal munitions, and breaching tools. In support of our existing programs *Sabre TTRR* offers *Two* levels of S.W.A.T. training. Each level supports the previous course syllabus. In many cases *level two* courses can be utilized by existing *Teams* to build upon previous S.W.A.T. experience.

1. Initial team work building, weapons skills, and curriculum core fundamentals. (*see below list.*)
2. Team progression and continuous flow, building on the established training concepts from level one core curriculum. Extending *Students* abilities to high levels of expertise.
3. Tactical development of *Team* members to *Team Commander* level. Progressing skills, and establishing *Command Band* experience Level two courses combine the training concepts from level one.

Students train to the highest levels of understanding. This course instructs in the planning of high risk operations. In the collation of evidence, and intelligence gathering. Culminating in the tactical implementation of the S.W.A.T. operational task itself.

S.W.A.T. courses can be designed to cover any of the curriculum areas as needed. Agencies simply have to identify specific areas of training to be developed, and STTRR will design the program around those needs.

STUDENT COMMENTS ON C.A.R. SYSTEM

“ When analyzing the events that proceed *Operator Death*’s, you must come to the inescapable conclusion that such death’s are the result of a sequence of mistakes.....Not just one mistake. These mistake’s when analyzed, often follow a similar and recognizable pattern. This pattern more often than not, consists of :

1. *Unrealistic and insufficient training.*
2. *Inaccurate and / or ignored intelligence.*
3. *A poor or complete absence of a sound tactical plan.*
4. *Team chaos created by unexpected suspect action, and the inability to effectively respond due to #'s 1 through 3.*
5. *Mr. Murphy presenting his ugly head at the worst possible moment.*
6. *Operator death.*

The **C.A.R.** system is the first training system I have experienced that has truly been designed around the idea that *Operators* must train for *Gun Fights*. Unlike conventional systems that have evolved into training Operators to address *paper targets*, from a *static line* position.

Paul Castle has recognized what all *true Operators* know in their heart’s to be true. The systems we have been taught (*isosceles, weaver*) are fairly effective in a range environment, but, have been proven **IN BLOOD** to be wholly ineffective in *real* gunfights.

Paul Castle has done what the rest of the Tactical Operator Community around the world has failed to do. He has solved the problem. Paul has developed a system in **C.A.R.** that works in the *real world*, in *real gunfights*, in *deadly encounters*, that will save your life. Give yourself and your *Team* the greatest gift you can give. A system and a plan to survive. Try this system. Give it a chance to reveal itself to you, you will never look back.”

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT FOR THE TRAINING

- * Students should bring protective clothing suitable for the course location. They will need to be able to *self sustain* with food for a 8/9 hour day.
- * Full ACU's / Combat / SWAT gear should be worn if issued. A hard *Protective Helmet* and eye protection should be worn at all times. Ear protection is highly suggested.
- * 600 rounds of Duty Pistol/Carbine ammunition.
- * 6 additional spare magazines for Pistol/Carbine.
- * Weapons cleaning kit.
- * All other course equipment is provided by STTRR.
- * All Students receive a fully bound training manual and CD/DVD.
- * Students may make a video record, and take photographs during the training sessions should they so wish.
